



CONSTABLE PITA FUAFIVA SNR POLICE PACIFIC SCHOLARSHIP

REGULATIONS:

1. The Scholarship shall be known as the Constable Pita Fuafiva Snr Police Pacific Scholarship.
2. The Scholarship shall be awarded to a candidate who is enrolled and has paid the fees, or arranged to pay the fees, for a full-time Doctoral study programme at the University of Auckland. Applications will be accepted from a wide range of disciplines where the research topic is related to crime or policing.
3. One scholarship of up to \$12,000, will be awarded annually, for a period of one year, and may be renewed for up to three years. The Scholarships' emolument will be paid in two instalments; at the beginning of the first and second semesters.
4. The Scholarship is tenable by students of Pacific descent who are New Zealand citizens or permanent residents of New Zealand.
5. The basis of selection shall be academic merit. This will be measured on the grade point average assessed over the applicants' two most recent years of equivalent full-time study, plus the quality of his/her research proposal and curriculum vitae. In considering applications and awarding the scholarship, the selection committee shall have due regard to Pacific descent, and the availability and ability of the applicant to be a role model to Pacific students, and to make presentations from time to time to relevant groups and schools on the topic of crime or policing.
6. The Scholarship will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of a selection committee comprising the Vice Chancellor of The University of Auckland (or nominee), the Director of Pacific Studies (or nominee), and two representatives from the NZ Police.
7. The successful recipient will be expected to report progress to the NZ Police at the end of each year of support. The recipient will be expected to acknowledge support of the NZ Police in any publication, monograph, report or presentation that results from the research.
8. The University of Auckland Council has power to terminate or suspend a Scholarship, if it receives an unsatisfactory report on the progress of a Scholar from the Head of the Department in which the student is enrolled, or the student is found by a court to have breached the criminal law.
9. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if in any year there are no candidates of sufficient merit.
10. The University of Auckland has power to amend or vary these Regulations, in consultation with the NZ Police, provided there is no departure from the main purpose of the Scholarship.
11. Applicants will be required to sign an undertaking that they agree to the selection committee receiving a copy of a record of any criminal convictions held by the Wanganui Computer Centre (or its successor). This is to ensure that the recipient has not been found guilty of an offence that is inconsistent with upholding the law.
