

THE UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND JUBILEE AWARDS (NON SCHOOL LEAVERS) CODE NO 515

All Faculties

REGULATIONS:

1. The Awards shall be known as The University of Auckland Jubilee Awards (Non School Leavers).
2. Up to 15 Awards will be made annually, each for a period of three years, and will be of the value of \$2,000 per annum.
3. The Awards will be offered to students who are New Zealand citizens or permanent residents of over two years standing, with no previous study towards an undergraduate degree intending to enrol in a full-time undergraduate degree programme at The University of Auckland.
4. The basis of selection will be academic merit, motivation to succeed at University and financial need.
5. The Awards will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of a Selection Committee comprising the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) (or nominee), Pro Vice-Chancellor (Equal Opportunities) (or nominee), and three members of the academic staff.
6. The Award's emolument will be paid in two instalments, one in the first, and one in the second semester.
7. An Award may not be held concurrently with a University of Auckland Scholarship, a University of Auckland Chancellor's Award for Top Maori and Pacific Scholars or a University of Auckland Alumni Scholarship. However, it may be held with any other award or grant as long as a) the terms of that award or grant permit and b) the University of Auckland Council is informed and approves.
8. As a condition of tenure of the Award, awardees will be required to undertake a full-time degree programme of study at The University of Auckland and maintain a grade point average of 3.00 (C+) in each year of study. The University of Auckland Council has the power to terminate or suspend an Award if it receives an unsatisfactory report on the progress of an awardee from the Director/Head of the Department in which the recipient is enrolled.
9. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make the full number of awards if in any year there are not candidates of sufficient merit.
10. The University of Auckland has the power to amend or vary these Regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Awards.
11. Applications by way of a form close with the Scholarships Office on 1 November of the year preceding the award. If the closing date falls on a Saturday or Sunday, applications will be accepted up to 5pm on the next working day.

Notes:

- (i) A Jubilee Award must be taken up within eighteen months of its award. If a student enrolls at another tertiary institution in New Zealand, the Award will lapse.
- (ii) For the purposes of this Award, non school leavers are defined as those who have not studied at secondary school level during the year of application.
- (iii) A student who has completed a Foundation programme, eg. TFC, CHSC, is eligible to apply.

APPLICABLE STUDY: **First three full-time years of an undergraduate degree programme**

CLOSING DATE: **1 November**

VALUE OF AWARD: **\$2,000 p.a**

TENURE: **Three years full-time study**

FOR: **Assistance with living costs or tuition fees**

NUMBER ON OFFER: **Up to 15**

The Awards were established in 2007 and are funded by The University of Auckland.

The main purpose of the Awards is to assist students entering the University with no previous study towards an undergraduate degree who have the potential to succeed at University and for whom the financial assistance would make a significant contribution to their financial needs.

SELECTION PROCESS:

- application by form is made to the Scholarships Office
- the application must be accompanied by a brief Curriculum Vitae, a statement from the student and a statement from a referee
- a Selection Committee assesses the applications
- the Awards are made by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Selection Committee
