

HEI RERE MAI SCHOLARSHIPS CODE NO 676

REGULATIONS:

1. The Scholarships shall be known as the Hei Rere Mai Scholarships.
2. Up to 10 Scholarships will be awarded annually, each for a period of one year. The value of the Scholarships will vary between \$5,000 to \$10,000 per annum, with a total funding pool of \$50,000 per annum. Current recipients may reapply for a second or subsequent year of funding.
3. The Scholarships will be awarded to Māori students who have enrolled and paid the fees, or arranged to pay the fees, for full-time enrolment at any level in a Bachelor of Business and Information Management, a Bachelor of Engineering or Bachelor of Engineering (Honours), a Bachelor of Science majoring in Computer Science or a conjoint involving any of these degrees.
4. The Scholarships are tenable by Māori students who are citizens or permanent residents of New Zealand (See Note i).
5. The basis of selection will be academic merit, demonstrated financial need and intention to study in the field of information and communications technology.
6. The Scholarships will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of a Selection Committee comprising the Pro Vice Chancellor – Māori (or nominee), the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering (or nominee), either the Dean of the Faculty of Business and Economics (or nominee) or the Dean of Science (or nominee) and two representatives of Two Degrees Mobile Limited.
7. In accordance with the advice of the Selection Committee, the Scholarships will be paid as a tuition fees credit, a lump sum credit in two instalments (one in the first, and one in the second semester), as a fortnightly stipend or any combination of the above. (See Note iii).
8. The Scholarship may be concurrently held with any other award or grant as long as a) the terms of that award or grant permit and b) the University of Auckland Council is informed and approves.
9. The University of Auckland Council, in consultation with the Donor, has the power to terminate or suspend a Scholarship if it receives an unsatisfactory report on the progress of a Scholar from the Dean of the Faculty in which the student is enrolled.
10. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if in any year there is no candidate of sufficient merit.
11. The University of Auckland has the power to amend or vary these Regulations, in consultation with the Donor, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Scholarship.
12. Applications by way of a form (plus CV and letter) close with the Scholarships Office on 31 March in the year of the award. If the closing date falls on a Saturday or Sunday or public holiday, applications will be accepted up to 5pm on the next working day.

Note:

- i) Applicants must provide evidence of their ethnic or iwi affiliations.
- ii) In making a recommendation for this scholarship the selection committee shall take into account other scholarships, bursaries and awards held by the candidates, with a view to achieving a fair distribution of monies among qualifying candidates.
- iii) Tuition/Compulsory fees are those only related to the relevant programme of study, plus Student Services Fee and Building Levy.
- iv) Recipients of this Scholarship may have the opportunity to gain work experience with Two Degrees Mobile Ltd.
